Dear Parents/Carers.

It's hard to believe we have just one more full week before we break for Christmas and step into 2026. Time is flying, but the buzz and excitement in school continue to grow. Let's enjoy every moment of this final stretch!

We've had a fantastic DT Week, with classrooms full of creativity, problem-solving and festive making. The children have produced some brilliant work, and we're ending the week on a high with today's Christmas Fayre – always a highlight of the term.

- In Nursery Nursery's book focus this week has been Stickman. The children have enjoyed retelling the story in our cosy new book nook, using the space to develop their storytelling confidence and understanding. Christmas festivities have also begun! The children have been busy creating Polar Express name trains, helping them to build their name-writing skills in a fun and festive way. In maths, they have been exploring AB patterns and have made Christmas paper chains to support their learning.
- In Reception Hill This week in Reception, they have been decorating biscuits and making Christmas wreath paintings ready for the Christmas fayre. They also continued learning about dinosaurs and produced some observational drawings of an ammonite fossil which were really impressive.
- In Reception Bond They are all looking forward to our EYFS Christmas Singalong and working extremely hard to learn songs and sign along as they sing also. They look forward to you joining them for an afternoon of Christmas songs next Thursday. They have a class dinosaur named Alfie who's set up home in their classroom and each morning they're all having so much fun trying to find a new addition, magic elf! He's getting 'here, there & everywhere!'
- In Year 1 Brown In 1 Browne this week they have been getting into the Christmas spirit. They've been busy designing and making cards to sell at the Christmas Fayre and they have also been practicing singing their Christmas songs for their performance.
- In Year 1 Potter This week the children have been working hard with their DT work. They have made Christmas cards to sell at the craft fair and we honestly think this is the most careful colouring we have ever seen in our lives! Mrs Kelly is so proud of them. They have also been practising their Christmas songs for their concert and the children have really enjoyed this and have done so well.

This has linked beautifully with our Design and Technology curriculum, where pupils learn to explore and evaluate existing products, develop their own ideas, and use a range of practical skills such as cutting, shaping and joining textiles. The children loved experimenting with different materials and practising their fine motor skills to make something truly special. On top of all the festive crafting, they have been hard at work preparing for their Christmas play. The children have been rehearsing lines, learning songs and developing confidence in performing for an audience. This supports the Year 2 English and Drama curriculum objectives, including speaking clearly, expressing themselves, and working collaboratively as part of a cast. Their enthusiasm is infectious and they can't wait for you to see the final performance.
- In Year 3 Simon This week, Year 3 have been busy getting into the festive spirit! The children did an amazing job creating their Christmas decorations and are very excited for their parents and carers to see them at the Winter Fayre.
